1. The infection is still strongly entrenched, and the irritative cough seems only to be kept in check by the morphia.
2. The heart has done well, but such bouts could only have one ending.
3. Whether or not the fluid has increased is doubtful - the flat note seems to me higher.
4. Very comfortable until about 7 p.m. when the flushed feelings begin and sense of discomfort and great heat without rise in temperature. Sometimes with this a feeling of nausea and retching.
