So glad to have your letter this morning, as now with the official approval I can prepare the circular, which I will ask Brown to translate into Persian and Margoliouth into Arabic. It will be quite brief and should be in English, French and German as well. Fill in very legibly and return to me the names of the local committee in Persia. I would suggest as the General Committee here the Presidents of the two Royal Colleges and the Royal Society of Medicine and of its Historical Section, that is Norman Moore, the Regius Professors of Medicine of Cambridge and Oxford, Professor Brown, Professor Margoliouth, Dr. Cowley, and the Persian Society. In France, the President of the Academy of Medicine, the Dean of the Faculty, the President of the French Society for the Study of the History of Medicine, and the Dean of the Faculty at Algiers. Do you know of any very distinguished Mohammedan physicians in India who might be asked - or in Egypt? We should easily, I think, be able to get the £600. If there was anything over I think it would be better to have it in a fund for having somebody look after the Tomb.

I have not heard anything about your article, which is strange. I will ask Garrod to look it up.

I wish indeed that I could pay a visit to the East, but I have to go West again this autumn.

Will you kindly act as Secretary of the Local Committee. I will act as Secretary of the General Committee. I suppose the Imperial Bank of Persia has an office in London, and we could open a deposit account with them.
