The Islanders should soon be hearing of Percy and his beloved their two months holiday is fast slipping away. Jennette was over for a flying visit on Sunday there had been one or two escapes even up to that time I think from all I hear there is more water around than is pleasant. Father has twice gone down to the Ch. St. wharf, with the intention of going over but the Boats do not run regularly yet and he had to return, they are a host in themselves else it would be very dull for them. How glad Annie and Freida must be to have you near them in a strange place and I'm sure it is a pleasure to you to be able to brighten them up even on those rainy days. We may have had one or two such but nothing can exceed the loveliness of the last few days. What a blessing it will be if in any measure Annie can find relief in her trouble she is so sweet and loveable and cheerfully patient withal. AnnielEnd, has gone on so well and has the sweetest of sweet girlies. I think it is to be named Elizabeth Lamond.
