Dear Musser

When are you coming down? MacDonald of Montreal will be here towards the end of the week. Could you not come & take dinner with us & stay the night - always a room ready. We have been much excited over Kartulis' amoebae which we have found in a liver abscess & also in the stools of a case of dysentery - a Dr. from Panama. They are most extraordinary & striking creatures & take ones breath away at first to see these big amoebae - 10-20 times the size of a leucocyte - orawling about in the pus. The movements are very active & in one case keep up for 10 hours. I get a frexh stock of pus from the drainage tube every day so if you could run down some eve. we could look for the creatures in the morning. Koch & Kortulis found them constantly in the stools and bases of the ulcers in Egyptian dysentery & the latter in the liver abscesses. Keep an eye on your Blockly dysenteries as it would be most interesting to find similar bodies in our dysenteries. I am off on April 20th by Etruria. Very busy - I go north for Easter - few days.
