My Dear Dr. Sanderson,

I hope that the Decrees you will have seen in the Gazette will fulfil your wishes. I am proposing to suggest to the Common University Fund who will be beneficiaries during the vacancy of the Waynflete Chair that you should not be allowed to perform its duties for nothing. If the weather abates today I am proposing to leave with Dr. Tylor the portrait of Dr. Kidd, Sir Henry Acland's predecessor in your chair which was bequeathed by his last surviving daughter to the University. It is in crayons by Eddis and under the terms of the bequest is to be placed in one of the rooms of the New Museum. I propose suggesting to the Delegates that you should be asked to find a place for it in one of the rooms of the Medical Department.
