

Gilman letters - 1898-99.

The following are examples of his correspondence - all of them notes in his own handwriting, to Mr. Gilman, with no date, though sometimes the day of the week is added.

Thursday.

Could you dine with me here at 6.30 on Thursday next to meet the members of the Physiological Society? Shall you have anybody staying with you?

Friday eve.

Would it not be nice to give Remsen a dinner? He deserves the fatted calf.

Monday.

Do you not think that a portrait of our late Dean [Welch] should adorn the new building? I am sure the members of the Faculty would be only too glad to subscribe. What do you think of it?

* Dr Welch resigned in June 1898.

I have to go out of town this afternoon at 3.30 with Dr. Opie. I do hope the Journal will go through, even if we have to increase the proposed subsidy. I would be quite willing for the first year to double my subscription.

It was very kind of you to send Dr. Thayers official notification to me, blessing in that way 'both him that gives and him that takes' How delightful the lecture was this afternoon!

Tuesday A.M.

I am not sure whether the enclosed will do - a sort of Bank Directors minute seemed scarcely appropriate. So sorry I cannot be with you.
