Dear Dr. Moore:-

I see in a note in Janus in connection with beri-beri, that a Dutch Committee has investigated the outbreak of the disease at the Richmond Asylum, and had stated that there were differences between it and tropical beri-beri. I am interested in the subject, writing up a section for the new edition of my text-book, and I wanted to refer particularly to the endemic neuritis as met with in institutions, since there has been here a very extensive outbreak in an asylum in the State of Alabama. I wrote some time ago to the head of the Richmond Asylum, asking if there had been any official report which I could obtain, and now I am troubling you with the same question. If there has been such a report, would you kindly send a postal card to the publisher, asking him to send it to me with a memorandum of the cost, and I will remit at once?
