I happened to see the brother of Fitcher's patient the other day, the original case described by Marshall, and he has, like his brother, symmetrical pigmentation of the conjunctivae and of the skin of the inner part of the ears. In the elder brother (F's patient) the pigmentation has increased very much within the past eight years. It has extended over the malar regions and the bridge of the nose. It is not the ordinary colour of melanoderma, but both in the conjunctivae and in the skin it is coal black like melanin. In reading about the cases have you seen this complication referred to?
