Dear Garrod:-

Thanks for your kindness about the Lancet proof.
I have just returned from Milwaukee, wher I saw
Ogden's case. He will send you the full notes. The ochron-
rosis is well marked in the ears and beginning in the sclerot-
ics. It is interesting, too, that he has slight pigmentation,
brownish in color, of the conjunctivae. My old patient re-
turned to town the other day, and I looked him over with the
greatest interest. Since I last saw him all the ligamentous

tissues ab out the knuckles and the tendons have become of a steel gray color. When he makes a fist the knuckles have a bluish gray color and the joints of the fingers look bluish. The staining of the sclerotics has become much more marked. A very remarkable point, by the way, about Ogden's case is that he has the same curios gait as the Jacjson brothers, - a stoop at the hips, with a curios swinging of the arms.
