At this meeting it was proposed that the former Bulletin of the ^{Struggling} Association be merged with the Medical Library and Historical Journal. The first issue published under the editorship of Albert Tracy Huntington appeared the following January and ~~was~~ during its all too short life this excellent journal continued ~~to be~~ ^{as} the official organ of the association and to furnish its transactions and book-exchange lists. With the death of Huntington the journal came to its end and after Osler's departure from America the association practically fell away in its activity.
