I beg to notify your Board that a meeting of the Confederation will be held at the Southern Hotel, St. Louis, Mo., Tuesday October 27th next at 2 p.m. This meeting will not only be of great interest but promises to be exceptionally well attended by representatives of state boards desiring practical interstate reciprocity in medical licentures in the near future.

Reciprocity certificates are at this time being issued daily between several of the states, members of and in sympathy with the Confederation and the executive officers of such reciprocating boards will be present at the meeting and will severally give brief address upon "Reciprocity from the standpoint of Experience in the Interchange of State Licenses".
