Dear Boggs:

Did I ever give you a copy of the God Headed Cane? Let me know please. I have picked up several copies lately. I do hope you will be able to come over this summer. We shall be here until the first of August and can always put you up. If the house is full you can take my rooms at Christ Church.

I would like you, please, to go over with Miss Humpton the Angina-Pectoris cases that have been in the hospital. I do not want very extensive notes, but just the main facts, name, age, sex, character of attacks, whether arterio-sclerosis was present and the post mortem. I do not think it would take you long. I have notes of the following hospital cases: medical number, 8675, J.W.E.; John Wood, aged 34, colored, admitted May 25th, the year not given, but it was while Dr. Camac was in the hospital. I want a brief note of the post mortem also, of Sallie B., admitted March 19th, 1906. I have very full notes but I want a brief abstract of the post mortem, particularly the state of the heart; S. W. Corbin, May 18th, 1897; I have full notes, colored man, aged 56, admitted June 15th, 1897 - I want the post mortem. He died on the 18th or 19th; F.T.W. admitted to Ward C November 17th, 1900, I have full notes, died December 27th. Was there a post mortem? I want a brief note of Dr. Budd's case, Ward C in May 1899. Then in the same month, same year, there was a case from South Carolina in Ward F - aortic insufficiency, who died on the evening following his admission in a remarkable paroxysm. I want the post mortem notes, which are most interesting, of D.D., aged 41, who was admitted May 24th 1899, and who died next day.

Ask Miss Humpton if she has picked out all the angina-pectoris cases in my private histories. Please get her to work at this with you at an early date.
