The following letter was written to me as Secretary of the Clinical Section of the Third Annual Meeting of the National Association for the Study and Prevention of Tuberculosis. Dr. George Dock was Chairman, and Osler had told him that he would read a paper on "Tuberculous Pneumonia" in association with a symposium on mixed infection. Osler, also, told Dock that he might be able to bring Teneeloo with him. Not hearing further from Osler, I wrote asking him how the matter stood as far as he and Teneeloo were concerned, explaining how anxious we were to have both. His reply to this letter is interesting from the fact that although he was in England two years, he still considered himself one of us:-
