Dear Mr. Gilman:

Thank you very much for returning the manuscript and for your criticism. I think the name would have to be carefully considered. I doubt if the word College could be used. I will bring out more clearly the distinction you refer to between the requirements of a cataloguer or attendant and those of the men who wish to take up administration work. A big scheme might, of course, appeal to Mr. Carnegie, and the question is who would be the best person to present it if it was put together in an attractive form. I suppose, in this country, John Morley is as close or closer to him than anyone-- what do you think?
