Oxford, 13 Norham Gardens, March 18th. 1907

All this time I have been wondering when your account of the Louis affair was to come out and I saw no reference to it until dear old Dr. Fletcher sent me the proofs of the Index Catalogue volume with O and the bibliography of my writings. There to my surprise under biography was the reference to your paper, which I had overlooked in the journal. It was really very kind of you and I appreciate the article very much indeed. Many thanks for your papers received yesterday morning. I was interested in the hematological paper, as I just returned the other day from the Midhurst Sanatorium, where Dr. Bardswell had been showing me a blood study in tuberculosis with extraordinary R.B.C. count, many of the cases amounting to polycythemia. I wish you would send your reprints to the Library, King Edward Sanatorium, Midhurst, Surrey.....We expect you here en route for St. Moritz.
