Dear Adami:

Thanks for the Money Order. I felt very badly, and regret exceedingly now, that I did not cable you on the Sunday or Monday after learning from Gotch and Thomson of the quite unexpected strength developed by Dreyer, owing to the letters which had been sent in to the Vice Chancellor and others from the Radcliffe Travelling Fellows who have been working with him. I really did not think that a foreigner had much chance, but when we had narrowed down to you and Dreyer after the second ballot I saw it was hopeless. We are getting it rather hot in some quarters about it.

Welch tells me that he thinks after your buildings are up the Rockefellers may give a bequest for research.
