Dear macAlister:

I see my old fellow student Zotique is giving trouble. If in the affaire Herbert there was anything disreputable the British Gynecological Society should have taken pains to remove his name. Not having done so, and if, as he says he has, the necessary forms have been sent in, it only remains for the Council of the R. M. S. to determine whether he is fit and a proper person. I have told him frankly that if the newspaper reports have any fraction of truth, he would not have a ghost of a chance of being elected. I suppose with the Council rests the final decision. He is not likely, I should think, to bring an action in which the French linen would have to be one of the exhibits.
