by Bayle & Thillaye (Paris 1855) No doubt the well-known most probably owns. (He is not in (P) Bayle or Chaufepie)
I had found in Geneva a copy of the works (Latin verse) of Arthur Johnston, M.D., (ed. Middelburg 1642, I think) and sent it to W.O. at once. Later I found that Dr. Samuel Johnson had tried in vain to find a copy at Aberdeen, where A.J. had been Rector of the Univ., & where his works were first printed. So I called WO's attention to this fact noted in Boswell's Tour to the Hebrides, under Aug. 23, 1773. reprinted in Croker's Boswell's Johnson ed 1831, II, 328. Not Wren but Wien, i.e. the Vienna copy of the "Christianismi Restitutio" of Servetus. The photos. mentioned were used in WO's Servetus, 1909.

The "reprint"is of course that by von Murr, 1790. Dr. Payne subsequently bequeathed his copy of it to WO". Resenthal "is Ludwig Rosenthal, the Munich bookseller. (I gave WO the German translation of the above work by S.)
