Excellent library 200 - 300,000 vols. Modern books, well represented. 500-600 incunabula - not many med. No Mundinus MS. The 1st edition 1478 Pavia, is a small folio - no woodcuts. Good 1st ed. of Vesals. Anatomy. 2nd and no notes etc. 1st book printed in Pavia 1471.

The courts of the University are imposing. No students stemmas as Padua and Bologna. Many monuments to Professors - a few old ones with the Prof. and students carved in stone - one with the students very good. No photos to be had.

There is a 1655 monument to Petrus Franciscus Phrygens "Galeni et Hippocrates duplici olim spiritu afflatus"! - not bad for Petrus.

Laboratories good. - a fine modern institute - plenty of work going on.
