Letter in W.O.s account book.

- Jan 17<sup>th</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> attack renal colic (not right flank 050) 5<sup>th</sup> on eve a twinge of pain in right side, that it was in bowel <sup>Jan 18</sup> at 8 am very severe attack pain in right side, nausea, vom. sweat, 1/4 morphine gave relief, sleep - return in eve.
- " 19<sup>th</sup> Return sleep in eve.
- " 20 Bowel attack middle of day, morphine again. Good night.
- " 21 Sleep - attack this day
- " 22 " " " "
- " 23 13<sup>th</sup> 5<sup>30</sup> sharp pain return from comfortable all night -
- " 24 8<sup>30</sup> passed uric acid calculus. Very well tho very shaken & used up.
