Are the statistics of the Mount Sinai Hospital available on the question of incidence of angina pectoris among the Hebrews? In the class of cases, for example, worked out by Buerger, does angina pectoris occur? How far do you think tobacco is a possible element in these cases? If the statistics are published, could you get one of the young men to pick me out the ratio of cases of angina, to the admissions on the medical side, for, say, the past 10 years?

In looking over my private records I am much impressed with the large number of cases of angina I saw among the Hebrews.
