Dear Harry T.-

We are off here in North Wales at a lovely spot where we have taken a house for six weeks--close to the sea. Ike got back from camp at Salisbury Plain where he had a very happy time. He is 1 1-2 inches taller than I am and looks well. He is no student and never will be. Study is not to his mind, but I am not worrying. He is a good lad and will do well. I was sorry not to see Mary before I left, but I had to go to Paris for two days and had only a day at home before leaving, but your sister wrote that she was better... She had had another spell of fever. I must say I do not like these erythemia outbursts with fever. One I think I mentioned. She had had some of these curious transient spots of painful erythemia--such as one sees in endocarditis. I have asked your sister to watch the temperature. There were no changes in the heart.

So glad you have had a good summer at the old place. I remember it on the occasion of my first visit to the Blue Ridge--before I went to Baltimore. Delightful letter from Trudeau with photograph has just come. He is holding his own. Love from us all.
