Dear Mac:-

Thanks for the memorandum. I see it was under Tabes and not Syphilis that I was to do the 606 and the Wassermann - that is all right. I am afraid you will have to append the paratyphoid to the proofs. I have put in the Brill's disease with typhus, and I have done the plague, as you will see in plague pneumonia.

I have re-written the poliomyelitis and it must go in with the Infectious Diseases. I have written to Henry Thomas about some points in the Nervous Diseases. I think it would be well to have a new index. I am sending by to-morrow's steamer the last of the infectious diseases. I have written a new section on Acute Tonsillitis, dealing with the epidemic form, and have put in acute catarrhal fever. Then the small sections on Febricula, Catarrhal Jaundice, and Glandular Fever, should go in at the end. I have cut out Mountain Fever there, and put it in after sunstroke, as it does not belong to the infections. I have added a brief section on that interesting Rat-bite Fever.

You will see that I have cut out a good deal in places, and I think we shall probably be well within the limit.
