Dear Aunt,

I remember the visit well, I think Mrs. O. & Revere were with W.O. in Venice and they went home while he went to Rome for one or two days and came up from there & joined us in Cannes. He brought photos that Revere had taken in Venice. Very remarkable for a boy, not of houses & boats, gondolas, etc. but details of capitals, friezes, gargoyles, etc. little things which showed a rare power of observation and a fine artistic feeling. W.O. was very proud of them and predicted he would become an architect or an artist. I think he stayed with us but two days - one afternoon Dr. Morris Murray, who with his family had been spending the winter in Cannes, asked us out to the Golf club - I played abominably and W.O. walked around as he had no golf clothes. Another day he called upon Joseph Chamberlain who was wintering in Cannes but I forget whether or not he saw him, I think ~~he~~ did. It was near Chamberlain's end - at any rate he saw Mrs. Chamberlain - I went with him to call upon two or three doctor friends, one my old chap I recall, another who had been at Davos with Ib. but was now much better. Their names are Jones but all

was so glad to see him and he gave them great pleasure - I cannot recall about the Lenotte sketches. or who Vetter is, or Jake
