Dear Professor Osler:-

Pursuant to the following resolution of the Board of Trustees of Leland Stanford Junior University, I have been asked by President David Starr Jordan to offer you the Lane Medical Lectureship for the year 1913. The resolution is as follows:

"That the course of Lane Medical Lectures be given in the autumn of 1913 and that Dr. William Osler of the University of Oxford be invited to deliver these lectures with an honorarium of two thousand (\$2,000.) dollars payable from the income of the perpetual fund for the maintenance of the Lane Medical Lectures."

You no doubt are familiar with these lectures and know that ordinarily ten lectures are given upon a subject to be chosen by the lecturer, that these lectures are given usually twice daily for five days in September or October and that they take place in the Medical buildings in San Francisco. It gives us a great deal of pleasure to consider you as a possible lecturer here and we all hope and trust that you will find your way clear to accept it. If you desire any re-arrangement of the details of the lectures, we should be glad to take up the matter with you at once.
