Graves in children is always serious. It would be safer in so severe a case to have partial thyro-dectomy, which I think gives the best results. The trouble is there is nobody in this country who is, I think, very specially expert in it. ^KCocker, of Berne, is of course the best man, and it might be worth while if you had to take her to him. I suppose they have tried absolute test, ice-packed belladonna in increasing doses. I saw one case, also a doctor's child of eight that had the most extraordinary exophtalmos and tachycardia get quite well spontaneously.
