Many thanks for your kind contribution which Lady Osler will spend on some of our Belgian professors, of whom we have 15 settled here now with their families. Our friends in the United States have been most generous. We never could have done anything without their help and now the Rockefeller Foundation offers to look after some of the science men, so that I think the outlook is good.

It is a great ordeal but the country is coming through it in fine form. I am seeing a great deal of interesting clinical material at various hospitals. We have a ward of 1,000 beds here at the big Examination Schools and at the Town Hall. Fortunately, so far there has been very little typhoid. Lady Osler sends her love.
