You could build up a great Dept. on Sudhoff's lines. Singer has made a good start here- a special alcove at the Camera with all the science history books segregated. Mrs S.is making a handlist of English med. Mss. and we have three special students at work. Unfortunately Singer has been called off so the work is interrupted. We hope to have whi Withington here next year. The material in Bodley is enormous- all sorts of treasures. I am still struggling with my incunabula address - to 1480 -. I get very little time but I think I have got a fairly complete list. Am dealing with the books as illustrating the outlook of the profession in the first 25 years of printing. I have been getting some treasures lately - the Ms. of the Gloucestershire Med. Society Transactions, largely in Jenner's hand, with two of his papers. Much interested too in Hecquet- the original of Dr. Sangrado. Am seeing a great deal of interest - I go to the Canadian Hospital Cliveden, every Monday, to Shfondliffe every ten days & once a forthight to Pargaton [?] - the American Hospital. Revere joins Birkets as the orderly officer of the McGill unit, 358, which comes over next week & will have one of the big base hospitals. He has been at Cliveden for three mos learning his job. We expect Harvey Cushing next week. What a fine Vesal celebration they had. We have postponed ours until Heger [of Brussels] can come A great haul at Bodley - 4000 books from Prof. Bywaters library - all before 1600 - such treasures, 56 de Thou bindings: A Melanchthon, de Anima with Rabelais' signature

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
