Dear Mac:-

(1) Important correction posted in time to Appleton & Co., for the Saturday boat - if they pass the Censor! In paratyphoid inoculations, etc. you will find that I have cut out the same number of words. The Diabetes is the biggest section. There will be 30 - 40 single page corrections to follow - not extensive, as in a new printing they should not be as in a new edition.

(2) About the 1917 edition, I can get no word from Appleton & Co. I enclose copy of a letter I have written. If they cannot agree to these terms I will print an edition here for Great Britain and the Colonies and they can do what they wish. It could not appear in America, in which case it would not be worth your while to have any association with it. I would withdraw the work from circulation in the United States by a circular to the teachers October 1917. I can issue it here on a 20% basis. They must let us know at once, as we should be making ready for 1917. I have asked them to cable yes or no and to let you know definitely. If they agree to a 20% basis you make the contract on the plan of my letter of December 25th. They should have copyright for both Great Britain and the Colonies as well as United States.
