Sir,

I have pleasure in proposing, with the King's approval, that you should be a member of the Royal Commission which has been pleased to appoint to inquire into University Education in Wales.

The terms of reference are as follows:-

To inquire into the organisation and work of the University of Wales and its three constituent Colleges, and into the relations of the University to those Colleges and to other institutions in Wales providing education of a post-secondary nature, and to consider in what respects the present organisation of University Education in Wales can be improved and what changes, if any, are desirable in the constitution, functions, and powers of the University and its three Colleges.
