Dear Miss Loring

Just as soon as I could get the Gt. Lea Farm located I went to see Miss Parsons, who has been failing for three or four months. Lately there have been signs of fluid in the abdomen with rapid wasting and anaemia. I am afraid there is a growth deep in the abdomen. After receipt of your cable I made all arrangements for her transfer to Oxford, & we had hoped to send the ambulance today; but Dr Halpin, (a very good fellow, by the way) has just wired that she is much worse & not fit to move. Unfortunately I have to go to Newcastle or I should pay her another visit. She is being very well looked after & I asked Dr Halpin to get a nurse. I am afraid there have been domestic troubles which have upset her very much. I will let you know at once on my return from Newcastle I cabled today as I felt you would wish to know.
