Very good letters from Isaac, who seems very happy and full of work. Could you get off for a day and see poor Norman [Gwyn]? I am worried about him - or tell Jack Mac. [McCrae] to go down. It would cheer him. An enteric infection - and he has had malaria. I have not seen May [Osborne] for weeks. She is at the Brains' for Xmas. Gwyn [Francis] is at Bramshott.

We are all hoping that Gen. Jones will be in the saddle again next week.
