* I was sitting in my library reading recent asthma articles for the new edition of my textbook when a telegram was brought in from H.C. at no. 46 Casualty Clearing Station "Revere dangerously wounded, comfortable and conscious", condition not hopeless". I knew this was the end. We had expected it. The Fates do not allow the good fortune that has followed me to go with him to the grave - call no man happy till he dies. W. (ar) O. (ffice) telephoned in the evening that he was dead. The one consolation was that H.C. was with him, and that he and Cole and Brewer, also old friends, did everything possible. A sweeter laddie never lived, with a gentle loving nature. He had developed a rare taste in literature and was devoted to all my old friends in the spirit - Plutarch, Montaigne, Browne, Fuller, and above all, Izaak Walton, whose Compleat Angler he knew by heart and whose 'Lives' he loved. We are heart broken, but thankful to have the precious memory of his loving life.
