Dear Ned

(my daughter nursing in France)

I have just written scolding W. for not letting me know she was in London. She has now gone to Brighton - I suppose to the big new hospital she should have come to us direct. I must have missed one of your letters. You said you would notify me of her sailing. I have yours of the 27th ult. today (25th). She will be very happy & must come to us whenever she can. I have written to the chief matron about her.

Revere has been for six weeks in the thick of this fighting - the battery never more than a few days in one place. He writes most cheerfully but we have had anxious spells of 12-14 days without a letter. He had hoped for leave March 1st & then this retreat upset everything & his brigade has been following up ever since. My sister lost a splendid boy at Vimy Ridge. Sorry to hear you have been knocked up. I am all right again and very busy. Love to you all
