Dear Harry T.-

Delighted to hear that you are going to China. What an experience it will be. Any very early Chinese medical mss. before 500 A.D. send along. The trip should set you up, but be careful not to overdo. Send a line. Perhaps you will get back by way of Siberia and in peace times. Revere got back for ten days leave. You never saw such a change--a big, burly, hardened specimen--hands like a navie and face weather-beaten. He was only 24 hours from his battery in front of Belcourt(?) He has been in the thick of all this Arras fighting, and in the great round-up after the big barrage. He has kept well and is fortunately with a nice set of men. The game is not decided yet--the blue and the grey will be needed to turn the scale. The Germans are still very strong. What a tragedy for such nice people--as those we know. I can not bear to think of it. Splendid to hear such news of Hal.
