Bone

A Canadian Nursing Sister - Miss Milburn - came for the night. Her father, "Ned", was at School at (Weston) with Sir Wm. Heard more of removal of furniture and physical instruments on the Saturday afternoon up through the trap doors above - expelled with five others. Killed pig at Barrie, cost him eight dollars. Then at Trinity School at Weston nobody could get rid of the matron and daughter from room above. W.O. locked rooms above and others made paste of molasses - mustard and pepper - and put it on the stove. Fumes went up to the matron above through the stovepipe holes. The prisoners above stuffed hole with clothes and they below pushed poles up through. Then the matron and duaghter sat on holes above, and the poles again used. Last of all a bed used to block hole. The matron could not get a warrant in Weston, but got one in Toronto for their arrest. Two days in police court in Toronto the masters pleased that some one had got rid of the matron. They were fined one dollar apiece. Sir Wm. wishes to have a photograph taken of the Toronto Globe account of the police court affair.
