Dear Thayer

We hear that you have been ordered to France & are hoping that perhaps you may come thro. England. It would be so good to see you. The home-coming must have been very sad without dear Sister Susan to greet you. We are keeping well and very busy. It is very hard to get time for any continuous work - there are so many calls one way & another. I have been in London four days this week - meetings & committees & sick Canadians. I am so tired of sepsis and of chest wounds, and *glossy* ~~the~~ nerve - hands & feet. They will be glad to see you at G.H.Q. Give my love to Bradley. Let us know of anything you want - for yourself or the men with you. Mrs Chapin is in charge of the distributing office Am. Red +, London, but comes for the week ends.
