Dear Sir William,

The explanation of Rhea's continued stay is that the loss of the Llandovery Castle\* has caused the Admiralty to stop all movements of Hospital Ships to Canada; none have gone for a month.

Perhaps for our purpose this is as well, for I find that Rhea has taken no action until this week regarding his MS. Now he has promised to write me some introductory notes before leaving, and has put the matter in train.

The best of thanks for inviting me to the Canada Club luncheon: only yesterday I received an invitation from Colmer, which I have accepted.
