Some books coming in at every meal-time. Parkes Weber in a new ed. of "Aspects of Death" dedicated to W.O. gives some refs. to skull and cross-bones. W. O. to review book for Annals of Hist. of Med. A Prof. Rand of Harvard here for lunch. Is interested in Locke, and W.O. said that the Earl of Lovelace has so many of Locke's letters. W.O. says that Welch was born with hypertrophy of the heart and that in addition to a three-storey intellect he has 3 attics on top. Talked about the Colleges and F.R.C.S. Exam a disgrace - W. O.'s letter to Lancet came at a very opportune time when committee were discussing it. One man working here at physiology was plucked in that subject. Colleges should not give the degrees - Norman Moore would have to give up the power. N. M. first R. C. President since Reformation - he was not appreciated enough at Bart's. A Prof. Cunliffe (Eng. Lit., Columbia) here for tea too. talk of post-graduate work for all kinds of students in London, Paris etc. W. O. on the Committee. Talked of all his case cards - not right to give all names - suggests picking out a typical case of each year for the library. Has all accounts kept. I wish him to put all the cards away in Bodley for 50 years - a monument to the amount of work done by him. Lday O. told me of joke W.O. played on Jack Hewetson. The latter was going to Phila from Balt. and W.O. told him to remember him to Dr. Shippen and Dr. Physick - they died away back in the 18th cent. W.O. almost split his sides when H. returned and reported that he could not find them at the hospital in Phila.
