iques. ...Two points are clear:- (1) Without radical changes nothing can be added to the present curriculum; (2) Pediatrics should be taken up as a specialty and not be left, as at present, in the hands of men almost half ashamed to be regarded as specialists. The big general hospitals should organise their departments on modern lines. London could well afford to have 5 or 6 children's clinics as good or even better than that of Howland's at the Johns Hopkins.
