We are doing everything possible to hasten the sending of food supplies, and we very soon hope to have a special Committee to meet the Minister of Foreign Affairs and ask to have supplies specially sent to Vienna Hospitals.- The American Red Cross people, through Mr. Davidson, are also stirring.

I sent your former communications directly to the Foreign Office, and copies were sent to influential people so that I hope they will have done good.

I could not possibly go to Holland this Spring, but I dare say that very likely a member of the "Fight the Famine Council" would be glad to meet you if you go there..

Ask your daughter to write from Holland if we could do anything to help her with the children.-
