Dear Osler,

We arrived here yesterday mid day, from Stroud, where ten days bracing air had done much for me; the fatigue of getting about in this ants' nest, will do much to pull me back, but I will get as much quiet and rest as I can. I fear the paper on Rabelais will be dull, because it has to be full of statistics and his bright stones are only "camouflage". I think I have traced the source of all of them.
