

From Dr. Malloch's Journal.  
1919.

Summer 1919 asked to give opening address at King's Coll. Med. School in the Autums. Also to go to Cincinnati (expenses paid both ways) for opening of Drake Memorial Buildings. Asked by Sir Walter to give lecture on Walt Whitman at Oxon. In Jersey he had all the Walt Whitman books and newspaper clippings with him and read over them all. But Lady O. said he must not give lecture till all the Nerv. System of the text book was done.

When he was in bed he always was very loath to have his bed made and Lady O. was ashamed, she said, of the untidy condition of things. The whole bed would be littered with things: books and papers, and notes and written letters.

Bill tells me that on reading certain passages of Mrs. Wiggs and the Cabbage Patch to them out loud in the library he was moved to tears and had to leave the room.

Lady O. tells me that when he was at J.H.H. he never charged his private patients in the Hospital anything.
