AMERICAN HOSPITAL FOR LONDON. -

CENTRE FOR INTERCHANGE OF IDEAS AND RESEARCH.

Arrangements are being made for the erection of an American hospital in London. It will probably occupy a site in the West End and will provide treatment for Americans in this country and constitute a centre for the United States medical profession.

The following physicians will figure among the staff:—Dr. Eric Pritchard (children's cases), Dr. John Eyre (bacteriologist), Mr. C. C. Choyce and Mr. Cecil Rowntree (surgeons), Mr. Willoughby Lyle (eye specialist), Mr. Philip Franklin (ear and throat), Dr. Harry MacCarmac (dermatology), Dr. Robert Knox (radiology), Mr. Victor Bonney (gynecology), and Dr. E. Bradner White (dental surgeon).

The consulting staff will include many well-known British and American members of the profession, among them being Sir William Osler.

Sir J. Bland-Sutton, Sir Humphrey Rolleston, and Sir Arbuthnot Lane.

It is intended that governors and a board of management, as well as trustees, shall be appointed to control the affairs of the hospital.

It is also proposed to elect distinguished members of the medical profession in America as honorary physicians and surgeons, and to foster relationships between the medical men of England and America, so that the peoples of both countries may benefit by interchange of the latest and best methods in treatment.

American doctors will be invited to utilise the hospital for the purpose of demonstrating the results of their researches.
