DISTINGUISHED COMMITTEE TO BE FORMED.

A meeting of those promoting the new American Hospital in London, an announcement of which appeared in The Times yesterday, will be held as soon as Lord Reading returns.

It is proposed to form an Honorary Medical Committee of distinguished American and British doctors, and it is probable that Sir Arbuthnot Lane, Sir John Bland-Sutton, Sir Henry Rolleston, Sir St. Clair Thomson, Sir William Osler (Oxford), Sir Clifford Allbutt (Cambridge), Sir Robert Jones (Liverpool), and others, will be invited to represent this country. The active staff of the hospital is to consist of a number of British doctors, among whom will be Dr. Choice. The house appointments will be filled by Americans.
