My Dear Sir

I received your favours of May 25<sup>th</sup> and am much obliged for the information which you have sent and which is all that is required.

I saw Mrs Abraham this morning. She gave me a small daguerreotype taken from Mrs Procter shortly after he died. Mr James Johnston of this place has taken it with him; he goes passenger by this steamer the Asia, and has obligingly offered to deliver it to you. In regard to the Portrait I shall get our store-man to pack it up carefully and send it to you by some

early ship direct to Liverpool. Mrs Abraham did not mention anything else but she will let me know in a few days if there is. She thought of sending some packets of letters but does not seem now to think that she will send them. I shall have occasion to see her in a few days and shall then learn exactly what she intends to send, and I shall see that they are carefully

sent by you. She is quite well but complains of being low spirited.
