That they have visited the property in question, examined the declarations and pleadings in the said Suit No 2720: have heard the parties and have obtained all information necessary to enable them to make their award.

That they now make their award as follows: They award to the said Plaintiffs in the said Action, to wit Dame Jane Loynachan, widow of the late Joseph Tinning as having been in community of property with him, John Morrin Tinning, Samuel Morrin Tinning, Annie Morrin Tinning and Elizabeth Tinning, children issue of the marriage of the said late Joseph Tinning, in his lifetime of the Town of Lachine, and the said Dame Jane Loynachan: and also the latter in her quality of Tutrix duly appointed ~~to~~ of Mary

Mary Morrin Tinning, minor child of the said late Joseph Tinning and said Dame Jane Loynachan, the legal heirs of the said late Joseph Tinning, all of the Town of Lachine aforesaid, the sum of Three Hundred Dollars as and for the damages suffered by them on account of the loss and deprivation of the portion of the farm leased by the said late Joseph Tinning from the said Dame Elizabeth Leishman and Albert Frederick Dawes and described in the Declaration in the said Case.
