Nov 4 Complaint against Lord Gosford that he had not removed John Glegg Thompson Fletcher Whitcher against whom proofs of misconduct had long been made by resolution of House of Assembly - Gosford had given hopes that evil doers would be removed but failed to carry out the expectation

The towns feared that Gosford would franchise the Legislative Council

A Bill for making a Law and from the opposite side to the Province Line received the Royal Assent 19 Augt 1836

Great complaints of the management of the Post office under the Management of Mr J. D. Stanyan who as Postmaster General (Deputy) in the former was general manager for the Post General Post Office Department in London which without our government having a voice controlled our post mail service

Nov 8 The Canadian of Quebec (Patriot paper) had become a warm advocate of Lord Gosford the Commissioner and the administration. The Patriots charged against it that in 1835, 36 he asked for certain things and declined he would never be satisfied till they were granted. In 1836 when there was not a shadow of hope that they will be granted we find him giving his support to that very administration that enhances & scatters our claims. This ratiing of Le Canadian gave great annoyance to the Patriots as it forced the defection of a strong Quebec party that had withdrawn from the determined contest.

The popular mind among the masses are much in abeyance waiting for the report of the Commission from which however the leaders of neither side had any good expectation. - The Herald declared in June Gibbs a scoundrel. Lord Gosford the despatch of all despatchers Lord Glenelg a broken reed and the Church Grey too eccentric and whimsical for any good
