My Dear Sir

Last evening I received the papers of the week and feel extremely mortified
at the insults offered to the Province by the sudden and unprovoked attack of His Excellency
Sir George Prevost - through the arts of Malin and his representation. His presence
during the war saved this Country - And now for his representation of carrying
with him the blessings and gratitude of its inhabitants whom he has united
and in peace. His appearance in England will soon I hope dispense the
present cloud and make to fall upon the heads of those who raised it
no doubt - *Tous S. Malin ex-nimis a Patrie.* It is to be regretted
however that His Excellency finds it necessary to undertake a tedious journey
at this disagreeable season - I suppose that you will accompany him -
If I can render you any service you have only to command
