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## PREFACE

Economics Three woke up and laughed. This gave me the idea that it might be of great service if economic problems could be discussed in the form of the literature of imagination. This would kelp to remove the argument from the angers and the bitterness that so often surround it. If we cannot discuss it like gentlemen let us at least discuss it like idiots. Having got the idea, all I had to do was to write this book.

Of the economic basis of this book I would like to say this.

Forty years of hard work on economics has pretty well removed all the ideas I ever had about it. I think the whole science is a wreck and has got to be built up again. For our social problems there is about

I believe that the only possible basis for organised society is that of every man for himself, - for himself and those near and dear to him.
